Centre of Languages and Communication (CLC) at Poznan University of Technology (PUT) is involved in numerous activities and events related to foreign languages and language teaching. First and foremost, we are devoted to teaching languages for specific purposes, which translates into teaching technical language at PUT.

Our activities, however, reach beyond mere language teaching. We organize nation- and university-wide events for students. CLC has teams of employees, offering linguistic support in a number of areas. We also have teams of qualified translators and a team of specialists in topics related to various aspects of academic writing. CLC teams also train students in soft skills, and operate and develop e-learning possibilities.

He discussed / tackled the issues of air traffic control and safety, as well as the linguistic aspects of interaction between ground crew and pilots.

This concluded the technical part of the seminar, and the participants moved to the second part of the meeting. The bravest participants took flights around the airport area, but the less brave ones only enjoyed a tour around the airport. And all participants enjoyed a pleasant barbecue lunch. Despite unfavourable weather, the seminar was a great success.
